GAMMA OMEGA FIRST IN MONEY RAISED FOR THON

The 2007 THON, held on February 18, was a great success. Once again, AT Ω paired with ZTA for another record setting year, raising nearly \$295,000. This is the 11th consecutive year that Gamma Omega has raised the most money of any other fraternity. During two weekends in the fall and five in the spring, the chapter stopped in places all over the northeast from Connecticut to Virginia, as well as made a visit to our neighbors up north in Niagara Falls. Our efforts were headed by **Tony Rauso '10**, **Tyler Wise '07**, and **Ben Cunningham '09** and much credit should be given to them for raising the majority of that large total.

The 36-hour dancing extravaganza took place this year in Bryce Jordan Center. The extra space accommodated 708 dancers, 702 moralers, 191 families and thousands of volunteers. The added seating in the center also attracted 12,000 spectators. When all was said and done, THON raised an astounding \$5.2 million, breaking last year's record by more than \$1 million.
