### Thank You for Your Input

Last spring the House Corporation conducted a survey of our alumni to identify which events and activities might be of interest. It was our intent to better understand what you, our alumni, expect and want in a Gamma Omega event. Thank you to all who responded; we learned a great deal. More importantly, we listened to the feedback and have acted on this information. Your survey feedback was instrumental in developing the plan for this year's Founders' Day celebration.

Over 120 surveys were returned with responses, and many included constructive ideas that would help improve attendance and participation at alumni events. Homecoming and Founders' Day were identified as the most popular events for State College, while the next most popular were regional events. As a group, we have had some success in a few cities (Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, and D.C., in particular), but there is room for improvement. A key finding was that you would be more likely to attend if the event was geared toward your particular era (year group, pledge class) in the form of a reunion. It was also important to meet at the house, but offer other venues for activities as well. As a result, the house corporation has established this year's Founders' Day as a reunion for our Golden Taus, with events at the chapter house and the Nittany Lion Inn. We will continue to seek your input to improve our events and to give everyone the opportunity to reconnect with AT $\Omega$ , Penn State, and the lifelong friends we made here.

### REFLECTIONS FROM A GOLDEN TAU

"Being in the fraternity was a good period in time," said **George Geiser '42**. "It was an impressionistic part of life since it was the first time I was away from home, but it gave me a certain sense of what life required."

George worked during college to finance his education. Working in a steel mill for Bethlehem Steel, he earned \$5.80 each day. This helped to cover the annual fee at Penn State, which was less than \$100 each semester, as well as the \$50 per month fee for room and board at the AT $\Omega$  house. George recalls that during his time at the University, the population stood right around 5,000 students, with 4,000 men and 1,000 women.

Reflecting on his time in the chapter, George shared, "I liked the formality of the organization and the friendliness of the brothers. Every year you lost a quarter of your friends but gained a new quarter. It was always fun to see the new guys come into the chapter."

After graduation, George worked for Westinghouse Electric Corporation for 43 years, earning the position of division general manager. In that time and through his experiences, George learned the importance of having the ability to get along with the people you worked for and who worked with you.

George now lives in a retirement community in Upper St. Clair, Pennsylvania, which he compares to a co-ed fraternity. There is still the chance to make new friends and he takes the time to enjoy golfing, bowling, and playing the piano for members of the community to sing along. George has three children, three grand-children, and one great-grandchild, with whom he celebrated his 90th birthday in December.
