2018-19 House Improvements Update

The Board approved the following projects, which have been completed.

- Restoration and painting for portico, railing, columns, and bases.
- New code compliant side entrance doors in the chapter room, increasing our capacity from 98 to 140.

ATΩ, ZTA Team Up to Raise More Than \$254,000 at THON for Childhood Cancer

or the past 24 years, ATΩ has teamed up with Zeta Tau Alpha sorority to be the top fundraising organization in Penn State's annual THON to benefit kids with cancer. Over the last couple years, however, it has become more and more challenging to meet our goals. With the absence of canvassing/canning for a lot of this past year, we had to get creative in how we fundraised. To replace the number of canvassing weekends that we lost, we had to increase the time we spent on other areas of fundraising, such as donor drive, THONvelopes, and corporate soliciting.

We have an alternative funds committee made up of about 50 AT Ω /ZTA members that has sent out thousands of THONvelopes and endorsed AT Ω /ZTA donor drives to get donations. In total, AT Ω raised a little more than \$102,000 for the kids. That amount AT Ω with ZTA's \$152,000 brought

our total to more than \$254,000 for childhood cancer! This amount was \$80,000 more than any other organization that participated in THON.

We are very proud of the work that we have put in and even more proud of our seven dancers that we had this year. Shane Heacox '19, Tyler Smith '19, Matt Holloway '19, Nick Pilhuj '19, Alyssa Fairweather, Braelen Kralowetz, and Natalie Wagner danced for 46 hours straight and represented AT Ω /ZTA in a great fashion! Their hard work and dedication to this cause is unmatched and they paved the way for us to turn around and do it again this year. These graduating seniors will surely be missed!
