- Anonymous Donor Gives \$7,500 to Furnish Chapter House Living Room
- Chapter House Repairs Will Cost \$50,000

The Corporation Board has scheduled its next meeting for March 29, 2008, at State College.

During this meeting, the board plans to review and potentially amend the Gamma Omega bylaws. This note serves as written notice in accordance with Article XI of the Gamma Omega bylaws.

Thanks to all the alumni and their guests who attended events during Homecoming 2007. Returning alumni were greeted with a new living room, which was courtesy of an anonymous donor who made a gift of \$7,500 to furnish the room with leather sofas and a large-screen television. I cannot thank that alumnus enough for his generous contribution. I would also like to thank the undergraduates for being such great hosts. **Mike Walter '90** deserves a mention for the job he did in organizing everything.

Board elections were held during Homecoming weekend. **Chris DeVol '89** has stepped down after many years of tireless service. Thank you for your efforts and hard work, Chris. I am sure Mr. "Everybody Get Together and Smile" DeVol will continue to lend his experience to the board as well as be a fixture

at alumni events. We also welcomed back a former board member, **Bob Pilon '00**. Bob will be working with **Joe Cattano '66** to lead our alumni relations efforts. The board has been reorganized with each member heading up an area of responsibility (find the list on page 7). We also appointed a new undergraduate representative, **Kevin Hanna '10**, to serve on the board as a chapter liaison.

On March 29, we will hold a meeting of alumni and the board in State College. The purpose of this meeting will be to vote on bylaw changes. To the best of anyone's recollection, our bylaws have not been changed in over 50 years. Following the bylaw review, we will hold a board meeting. At the top of our agenda will be a meeting with architects and other design professionals to help develop a long-range plan for our chapter's

The house that we all love and remember is showing its age. It has been a significant number of years since we did any major renovations or upgrades. The Band-Aid approach used the last few years will not work any longer, and under the direction of **Mark Biro '79** we are focusing on improvements to the house infrastructure. Work has begun on a new boiler and heating system. We will also upgrade and possibly make other improvements to the parking lot (rainwater drainage and runoff has created a large ditch on the east side of the parking lot). These two repairs will cost us approximately \$50,000. We will need the support of our alumni base to fund these repairs.

The day-to-day operations of the house are financially supported through rent and parlor fees paid by the undergraduates. Because of their efforts to meet their obligations as ATΩs and fill the house (35 current residents), we are cash-flow positive. However, long-term care, maintenance and renovation are our responsibility as alumni. I would ask that any alumni interested in helping with the financial support associated with these repairs to please contact me or Rich Kuegler.

I encourage each of you to do two things: register on our new Web site, www.psutaus.org, and plan to come back to State College for our Founders' Weekend, May 30-June 1.

Key Communicators Needed

The success of any fraternity in today's world is a direct result of the strength and involvement of its alumni. At Penn State, fraternities that have mobilized their alumni base have prospered, while others have struggled to survive or disappeared from campus. Penn State ATQs are known for our success and achievement, both during school and after graduation. Our alumni include Fortune 500 executives, successful entrepreneurs, corporation presidents/CEOs, Navy Admirals, doctors, lawyers, and a host of others who serve their communities. Unfortunately, too many of us are disconnected from our fraternity and from the endearing relationships we formed at ATQ.

To help us bridge the gaps of time and distance, I am asking for your assistance in developing a group of interested alumni who will serve as "key communicators" with our brothers. A key communicator is a volunteer position designed specifically for bringing alumni into the "information loop" regarding Gamma Omega. This will help us build on our friendships and will provide personal one-on-one communication between alumni.

The principal functions of a key communicator will include the following:

- Regular telephone or personal communication with a target group of no more than 15 alumni of your own selection.
- Informing alumni of the status of the fraternity, including events, future plans for renovation and achievements of Gamma Omega.
- Personally inviting alumni to major events, particularly Homecoming and Founders' Day.
- Assistance in finding lodging and tickets for Penn State football weekends. This will be done in coordination with efforts by the House Corporation to secure rooms and tickets for major events.

Key communicators will not be expected to directly solicit funds for projects or act as agents for fundraising events.

I ask that alumni come forward who are willing to take on this most necessary function. Without the strong support of alumni like you, it will be difficult for Gamma Omega to continue its success at Penn State. This is a responsibility that should be both rewarding and pleasurable, as it provides the opportunity to renew old relationships and secure the continuation of Gamma Omega at PSU.
